We have indicated below with each task what the main subject focus could be.

Write a poem about the Easter story! English	Write a description of a place that you have enjoyed visiting. Think about what you can see and hear and don't forget those adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions to expand your ideas! <i>English</i>	Choose your favourite book and write a list of Questions about the book and answer them. <i>Reading</i>
Practise finding change from different amounts by pretending you run a shop and sell items to people and give them the correct change. <i>Maths</i>	Use real life objects (such as sweets or beads) to practise multiplying and dividing numbers by 2, 5 and 10. <i>Maths</i>	Make a seaside in a jar – see PDF on website for instructions. <i>DT</i>
Create a map with a key. <i>Geography</i>	 Choose between these two: 1. Research how the seaside town of Blackpool has changed over time, by comparing how it was in Victorian times to how it is now. 2. Research the dangers of the coast. <i>Geography</i> 	Write a diary entry about the Easter story from the point of view of Jesus or Mary. <i>RE</i>
Design and practice a 'Relaxation Technique' to show your PE teacher. Can you teach it to the class? PE	Create a flower picture using 'Pointillism' on the computer. Email it to your teacher and we can print it! <i>Computing</i>	Become a mini scientist and set up your own experiment at home to test materials! Science
Create a poster about rights of a child. PSHE- Could be done independently	Create your own piece of art work using the theme, 'Flowers in Spring.' Art - Could be done independently.	Research a favourite place that you have visited and write Questions and answer them from what you have read. Reading.
