## **COVID Contingency Plan**

The situation regarding the COVID-19 and subsequent government plans are continuously changing. We continue to follow the latest advice from Public Health England regarding our response. Currently, the guidance is clear that schools should remain open as usual, but that we should take extra precautions such as encouraging regular and thorough hand-washing throughout the day, etc.

We are following guidance that washing hands is the preferred option to limit the spread of infection. Children in school are regularly washing their hands. We also have hand gels in school that children are able to use under supervision.
