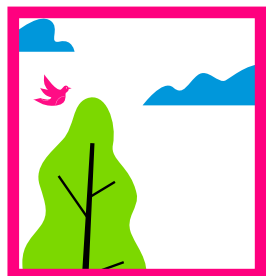


Activity 1

Open your favourite book and draw the main character. How has the author described them? Label your picture with the descriptions.

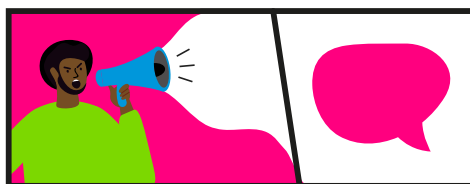


Activity 3
