Year 2 Curricular Goals

Maths

Problem Solving: Solve mathematical problems involving numbers to 100 using concrete objects and pictorial representations including real life contexts

Describe: use mathematical vocabulary to describe movement and position, similarities and differences in shapes and fractions of length, shape or quantity

Reading

Fluency: Read age appropriate books increasingly fluently to allow focus on understanding.

Questioning: Ask and answer questions about a book they have read to clarify understanding and make links.

Discuss: Take part in discussions about books, listening and responding to thoughts of others.

Retrieve and record: information form non-fiction texts

Writing and SPaG

Phonics: use Phonetic knowledge to support spelling by segmenting words into learnt phonemes and learning new ways of spelling phonemes.

Purpose: write for different purposes.

Improve: amend and improve work by checking own work for spelling, grammar and punctuation, add, and improve words and phrases in discussion with the teacher.

Punctuation: Use capital letters, full stops and questions marks in their work

Tenses: Use present and past tense correctly with increasing consistency.

Science

Group: Identify, group and classify.

Perform: Perform Comparative tests.

Record: Observe and record data noticing similarities, differences and patterns and use this to suggest answers to questions.

Stories: Retell a selection of key stories and discuss their importance.

Navigate: Read world maps, atlases and globes to identify United Kingdom and it's countries.

Language: Use words and phrases related to the passing of time.

Art and DT

Cultures: Understand different works of are from different time periods and cultures.

Needs: show an understanding of the need for a range of food in a diet.
