School Vision

Context

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform in our school prospectus and appendix 1.

Aims and objectives

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school and ours SMFR family;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging to our SMFR family;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school as part of our SMFR family;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery apart from watches and plain earring studs in our school. In line with advice from The Association for Physical Education all personal effects should be removed for PE. Pupils unable to remove earrings should be required to make them safe by taping, front and back, which may offer a measure of protection. The taping should be sufficient to prevent the stud post penetrating the bone behind the ear should an unintentional blow be received (e.g. from someone or from equipment such as a ball).

Certain items of religious jewellery which cannot be removed will only be allowed with certain safety procedures put in place- please discuss this with the headteacher.

Extreme haircuts

The school does not permit children to have haircuts or hair colours that could serve as a distraction to other children.

Footwear

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels in school, so we do not allow this.

We allow children to wear smart trainers to school; these should be black in colour

The role of parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. Parents should ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is named, clean and in good repair. If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the Headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example religious objections, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will look sympathetically at such requests. Similarly, should an item of school uniform prove problematic for a pupil with disabilities, then parents are invited to draw this to the attention of the Headteacher.

The role of governors

The governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding this policy, and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all national regulations concerning equal opportunities.

Governors ensure that the school uniform policy helps children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

Monitoring and review

When monitoring this policy, through its committee work, the governing body will:

- seek the views of parents, to be sure that they agree with the policy, and support it;
- consider with the Headteacher any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensations;
- require the Headteacher to report to the governors on the way the policy is being implemented.

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Parents' Guide to Uniform at SMFR Including Price List

Why wear a uniform?

Wearing a uniform creates a sense of belonging to the SMFR family. It teaches children to dress smartly and take pride in their appearance.

Parent's role:

Dressing each morning is part of preparation for the day ahead. It is important parents encourage & support this so that children are in the right mind set for learning & success.

School Uniform Requirements

- White shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Grey/black shorts, trousers, skirt or dress
- Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan, with or without school logo
- Grey/white/black socks or tights
- Black school shoes or black trainers (preferably with velcro) (No heels)
- Tie (elasticated in KS1) and 39" in KS2



Optional & Weather Dependent

- School cap
- Blue and white gingham dress

PE Kit

- School PE Shirt from Sept 2022 (White t-shirts acceptable until Sept 2022)
- White t-shirt
- Black/Navy shorts
- Trainers for outside PE
- Black/Navy jogging bottoms for colder weather
- Royal blue v-neck sweatshirt, with or without school logo



Year 5 & 6 Children need an additional sports kit for lunchtime sports

Hair

- Hair styles should be appropriate for school
- Shoulder length hair must be tied back

Hair accessories with flowers, large bows etc are not part of school uniform

Jewellery:

- Jewellery must not be worn. However, if your child has pierced ears, small plain stud earrings may be worn. These will be taped over during PE.

Nail varnish should not be worn in school.

Cost

There is no obligation to purchase uniform from the school office. Many high street shops & supermarkets sell suitable clothing. However should you wish to purchase school merchandise the following prices apply: School Uniform
