How can you claim a free hot meal for your child?

Children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2

- These children are entitled to free hot lunches (universal free school meals) Children simply need to request a hot meal when asked each morning during register. The office will not charge based on their age
- In addition, some Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 children are eligible for Pupil Premium. Applying for this even if you do not wish to claim a free meal, <u>means the school receives additional funding</u> something we very much need. If you think that you may be eligible (see criteria in green box below) please see the information on our website or speak to a member of the office team https://www.stmarysfarnhamroyal.org/hot-meals/

Children in Nursery, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6

These children are entitled to free school meals & Pupil Premium if the family meets the criteria in the green box below. Applying for this even if you do not wish to claim a free meal, <u>means the school receives</u> <u>additional funding</u> something we very much need. CHILDREN WHOSE PARENTS/CARERS RECEIVE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS ARE ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND WILL GENERATE PUPIL PREMIUM FOR THEIR SCHOOL:

- ✓ Income Support (IS)
- ✓ Income-based (not contribution-based) Job Seeker's Allowance (IBJSA)
- ✓ The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit.
- ✓ Income-related employment and support allowance
- ✓ Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Children who receive IS or IBJSA in their own right are also entitled to receive free school meals.

- ✓ Universal Credit
 - Child Tax Credit except if you meet <u>ANY</u> of the following criteria
 - i) entitled to working tax credit (regardless of income)
 - ii) have an annual income in excess of £16,190 (Please note that this figure is for April 2017 and that it can change each year).

Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after their employment ceases, or after they start to work less than 16 hours per week, their children are entitled to free school meals.

Packed Lunches

Packed Lunches should be healthy:

- No foods containing nuts (including chocolate spread & peanut butter)
- No chocolate, other than biscuit based chocolate snacks
- · No sweets or high sugar foods
- All children should have a packed lunch drink.
- Left overs will be returned home in the lunch box so parents can see how much has been eaten

All children are welcome to choose on a daily basis whether they wish to have a hot meal or packed lunch. They will be asked each morning during registration at 9am. Unfortunately, if children are late and miss registration at 9am, they may miss the daily order and it may not be possible to provide them with a hot meal. In these circumstances please check with the office who order the hot meals each morning.
