At SMFR we use the SCARF PSHE/SRE scheme to ensure we teach children the correct scientific language at the advised age.

Ofsted's report on Relationships Education,2 which draws upon good practice, states that by the end of Key Stage 1 they expect pupils to know and understand:

- The basic rules for keeping themselves safe and healthy
- About safe places to play and safe people to be with
- That they have some control over their actions and bodies
- The names of the main external parts of the body including agreed names for sexual parts

EYFS	Private parts
Year 1	Private parts, hygiene, disease, genitalia, privacy, penis, vulva, breasts, inappropriate touch
Year 2	Genitals, penis, vulva, consent, appropriate touch, nipples, navel, testicles, sperm – seed, urine, embryo
Year 3	Good drugs-safe medicine, alcohol, substances, nicotine, tobacco, sperm, eggs, periods, puberty, menstruation, womb, uterus, vagina, ovary, cervix, vaginal opening, fallopian tube, homophobic bullying, same sex relationships, divorce and separation.
Year 4	Smoking, tobacco, nicotine, alcohol, safe drugs – medicine use, mental health, puberty, hormones, vulva, vagina, ovaries, womb, clitoris, lips, breasts, penis, testicles, sperm, pubic hair, periods, menstruation, feminine hygiene, unwanted touch, personal body space, same sex and opposite sex partners, gender expectations.
Year 5	Smoking, tobacco, nicotine, alcohol, safe drugs – medicine use, habits and addiction, discrimination, aggressive/harmful behaviours, mental health, puberty, hormones, eggs, fallopian tube, vulva, vagina, ovaries, womb, clitoris, lips, cervix, anus, breasts, sanitary products, body hair, penis, testicles, sperm, semen, pubic hair, body odour, reproduction, periods, menstruation, fertilisation, feminine hygiene, unwanted touch, inappropriate contact, personal body space, female genital mutilation (FGM) biological sex, gender identity, gender expression, gay, sexual orientation.
Year 6	Smoking, tobacco, nicotine, alcohol, safe drugs – medicine use, habits and addiction, needles, syringes, substance, illegal drugs, cannabis, heroin, HIV, discrimination, aggressive/harmful behaviours, mental health and well-being, indecent images, puberty, hormones, eggs, fallopian tube, vulva, vagina, ovaries, womb, clitoris, lips, cervix, anus, breasts, sanitary products, body hair, penis, testicles, sperm, semen, pubic hair, body odour, reproduction, periods, menstruation, fertilisation, feminine hygiene, unwanted touch, inappropriate contact, personal body space, female genital mutilation (FGM) biological sex, gender identity, gender expression, gay, sexual orientation, stereotypes, gender stereotypes, gender expectations, media manipulation, sexual activity, legal consent, conception, intercourse, erections, wet dreams, condoms, pregnancy, reproduction, birth, transmitting and STI, IVF, surrogacy, adoption, forced marriage, arranged marriage, civil partnerships.
